Midland Berm Project

What's happening?

To protect the people and property in Drumheller from loss due to flooding, Wilco Contractors Southwest Inc. is constructing the Midland Berm. This project is part of the Flood Mitigation and Climate Adaptation System, managed by the Resiliency and Flood Mitigation Office.

Dates

This work is scheduled to commence mid-August and will continue until the ground freezes. Final cleanup and landscaping may occur in Spring 2023.

What to expect:

Below are the things to be aware of related to this project. Crews will make every effort to minimize the effect their work has on daily activities and will follow all applicable standards and bylaws.

- **Phase 1:** Pre-Construction (Mobilization): mid-August – early-September 2022
- **Phase 2:** Demolition and Removals: mid-September 2022
- **Phase 3:** Earthworks and Drainage Installations: mid-September – mid-November 2022
- **Phase 4:** Final Cleanup and Landscaping: Spring 2023
