North Drumheller Grove Plaza Berm Project

What's happening?

To protect the people and property in Drumheller from loss due to flooding, Wilco Contractors Southwest Inc. is constructing the North Drumheller Grove Plaza Berm. This project is part of the Flood Mitigation and Climate Adaptation System, managed by the Resiliency and Flood Mitigation Office.



What to expect:

Below are the things to be aware of related to this project. Crews will make every effort to minimize the effect their work has on daily activities and will follow all applicable standards and bylaws.

- **Phase 1:** Pre-Construction (Mobilization): mid-August early-September 2022
- **Phase 2:** Demolition and Removals: mid-September 2022
- Phase 3: Earthworks and Installations: late-September mid-October 2022
- **Phase 4:** Final Grading and Landscaping: mid-October mid-November 18, 2022 (weather permitting)

- The pathway under Gordon Taylor bridge connecting the west with the east side of Highway 9/56 will be closed mid-September to mid-November 2022 (dates TBD).
- We ask that residents accessing the commercial Grove Plaza area, including the Travelodge, be cautious of construction equipment entering and exiting Grove Plaza.
